IFPTOHE objectives were shared with MO's in the newsletter of December 2019 as key features and function of the IFPTOHE subgroup:

Development of IFPTOHE website

World Physiotherapy Congress 2021 (online)

The IFPTOHE committee is currently working alongside the WPC team to develop networking opportunities for our members. We have encouraged our peers to submit their abstracts for congress sessions. In 2021 a focused symposium is not arranged, we will aim to organize a focused symposium at WCP 2023 Japan.

Financial report

IFPTOHE currently works without fees from MOs. Therefore, currently there is no IFPTOHE financial report.

The Executive Committee is carefully considering the introduction of membership fees. Our considerations include: monies required for future activities, ground work that needs to be covered to prepare for fee-paying membership, how to administer fees eg fee structure, location of bank accounts, and currency to use.

We are slowly learning about how other WP subgroups manage their finances and the costs and benefits of this. It is fair to say that we are some way off having fees, so we welcome MO views on this topic.
