Safe and healthy work in the digital age 2023-2025





The European Centre for Workers' Questions (EZA) has rolled out a rich educational programme this autumn with a series of seminars dedicated to the impact of digitalisation on occupational safety and health (OSH). Organised in October and November by EZA's member organisations across Europe, the events address the challenges and opportunities posed by digital transformation for workers, employers, and social dialogue.

Topics include the implications of digitalisation and for the value of work and workers' rights, the role of the European Pillar of Social Rights in safeguarding OSH in the digital era, and discussions on AI in day-to-day work, its risks and opportunities.

Other seminars focus on the latest developments in digital work, including, monitoring systems, digital platforms, smart working, , as well as thought-provoking debates on the broader meaning of work in the digital age.
